FROM THE PASTOR...

By now you have probably had a chance to look at the model of the new church building. It's exciting to realize that we have begun this great building campaign. Since August, many leaders of Our Savior's Way have been working hard to make our dreams for a new church building into a reality. The model of the new church is the result of many months of work by the Building Committee under the leadership of Phil Jones. Another group of key leaders in the building project are the leadership team for the Building God's Kingdom 3year Capital Funding Campaign. These dedicated folks have been working hard since last August under the direction of Rick Burtner. This month is when the campaign really gets into gear. I thought I would take this opportunity to answer some of the questions that I have been hearing about the Building God's Kingdom campaign.

What is Building God's Kingdom?

Building God's Kingdom is a 3year capital fundraising campaign to help support the new building program. Members and families at Our Savior's Way will be asked to make a financial pledge to the new building program which will be paid over the next three years.

What is the purpose of the Celebration Banquet on Sunday, Nov. 13th?

The Celebration Banquet is just that—a time to celebrate the many blessings God has poured out on Our Savior's Way and the people of this congregation. It will be a time of food, fun, fellowship and inspiration at the Belmont Country Club in Ashburn. Don't miss it!

How much does the Celebration Banquet cost?

The banquet is free to members of the congregation. We want everyone to come and enjoy themselves. Child care will be provided at the church.

Will I be asked to make a financial pledge at the Banquet?

No, the Celebration Banquet is a time to celebrate. Pledges will be gathered through home visitations in the weeks following the banquet.

How much will I be asked to pledge?

Each family or individual will be asked to search their own heart and make a decision on what to give. The Building God's Kingdom leadership team has set a goal which is a weekly gift of one dollar to \$1.50 for every thousand dollars of your household income. For a family with a household income of \$75,000 per year that equals \$75-\$112 per week—the cost of dinner for my family at a nice restaurant.

What if I feel my pledge will be too small?

Pledge anyway. What is important is not the amount of money that you pledge for the new building, but the spirit in which your offering is given. The prayer of King David at the building of the Temple reminds us that it is a privilege to contribute to building God's house (1 Chronicles 29:14). St. Paul tells us that "God loves a cheerful giver" (2 Corinthians 9:7). And Jesus' story of the poor widow and her "two very small copper coins" teaches us that the attitude of one's heart and not the size of the offering is what is important when it comes to our offerings (Luke 21:1-4). Whether you plan on pledging \$1 million per year for the next three years or \$1 per year for the next three years, your gift is important to God. It is essential that all of us join together in this important work. No gift is too small.

Through the month of November please pray that God will enable us to meet the challenges that he has set before our congregation. Our Savior's Way is a young, vital and active Church with a tremendous potential. May God give us the faith we need to accomplish his will.

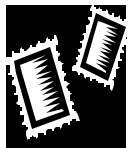

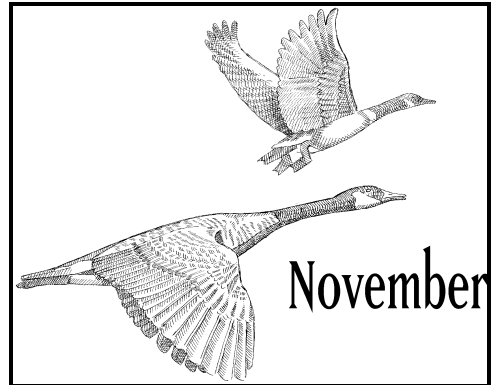

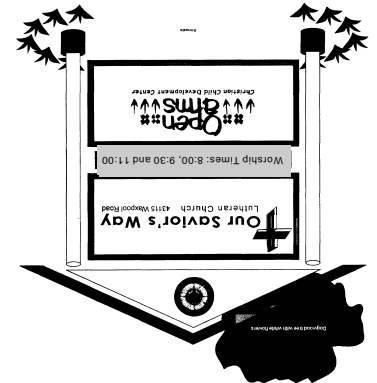
