FROM THE PASTOR...

Our Savior's Way is growing!. We have started out September in a big way with 378 people in church on the Sunday after Labor Day (a record for this date) and another record beginning enrollment in Sunday School this year. Our Savior's Way is a busy place this fall!

A new staff member joined us in the church office—Marcie Peterson. Marcie's title is "Director of Discipleship Development." It will be her job to match the gifts and the talents of the people at Our Savior's Way to the needs of our many ministries. Marcie will also be the contact person for THRIVENT matching funds. If you haven't taken advantage of THRIVENT, talk to Marcie and find out how to increase the effectiveness of your financial contribution to Our Savior's Way. If you can sign your name and write your Social Security number you can participate in this great program from THRIVENT (It costs you nothing, but the benefits to the congregation are tremendous!)

The congregation is still moving ahead with our building program. Be sure to take a look at the drawings and floor plans for the new building displayed in the lobby. The new building will enable us to double our worship space, double the number of our Sunday School and child care rooms, provide a place for a Pre-school program and a Youth and After School program. Right now the Building Committee is in the process of choosing a contractor. Construction should begin in 2006 and be finished in 2007.

The Leesburg Mission (now called Christ Community Lutheran Church) had its first informational meeting open to the community on Sunday afternoon, September 18. The event was a success! Vicar Doug Davis has been in contact with families living in Leesburg and western Loudoun County. The folks in Leesburg are anxious to begin worship and plan to establish a number of small groups in order to develop a larger core group of members before worship begins in Leesburg.

What is the "Benediction"?

The Benediction (pronounced ben-eh-DIK-shun) is God's blessing for the congregation given through the pastor at the very end of the service. There are several different benedictions that we use in the church. The "Aaronic Benediction" is the one that we use in the Divine Service. You can find this in Numbers 6:24-26.

Why is there a Benediction in the Divine Service?

The word "Benediction" comes from a Latin word meaning "to speak well." When the pastor pronounces the Benediction, God is giving us His blessing, or "speaking well" to us. He sends us on our way with His blessing after we have received all of His wonderful gifts through the Word and Sacraments. God sure does a lot of giving to His people!

For Parents

Before or after the Divine Service, direct your children to the various services in the hymnal. Encourage them to find and read the benedictions for each service. Help them find the Aaronic Benediction.

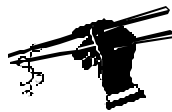

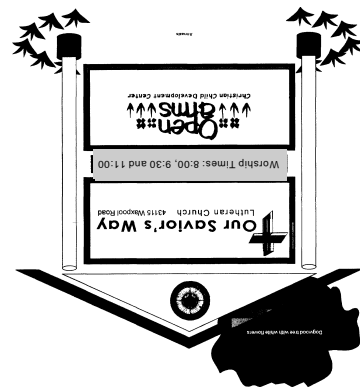
