FROM THE PASTOR...

One year ago we broke ground for the new building. Today the new sanctuary, youth area and ten additional classrooms are on their way to completion. Due to delays caused by bad weather, the building process is taking longer than anticipated. We had hoped to begin preschool in September 2007 with an expanded half-day program. The Open Arms Half-Day Preschool program will open in September 2007 with the current enrollment (classes are currently fully enrolled, but there is a waiting list). Since the new timeline given to us by the contractor pushes the date for new building occupancy into early 2008, expansion of the Half-Day Preschool Program will most likely have to wait until fall 2008. In the interim, as the building is completed, we will be expanding the Open Arms Before and After School Program and the All-Day Program into the new classroom space as it becomes available.

This summer will be "crunch time" for our Building Program as income from Open Arms and our Sunday morning offering tends to decrease and the costs for the new building and loan will definitely increase. Please keep Our Savior's Way, Open Arms, our teachers and staff in your prayers this summer. Pray for the safety of the children at Open Arms and in the Sunday School, and also pray for the safety of the construction workers who are working on the new building. If you will join with me in surrounding this project with prayer, I believe that God will bring us through this summer safely and, in His time, allow us to move into a greatly expanded space in the new building with many, many new and exciting ministry opportunities.

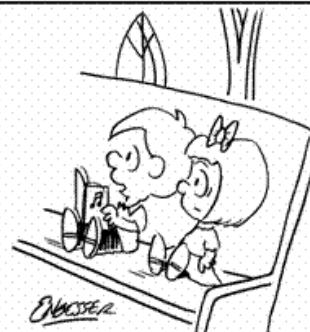

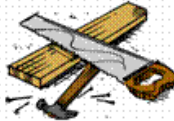


Project Linus At The Loudoun County Juvenile Detention Center

Thrivent/Habitat For Humanity Update St. Louis, VA (near Middleburg)



Below is a construction update from one of the coordinators/supervisors for the Thrivent Builds/Habitat for Humanity project.

June 18: Another two great days of building last Friday and Saturday and the weather was beautiful. Unfortunately we ate our last Banneker school lunch on Friday (til school re-opens in the fall) but we were well fed on Saturday by the Banneker PTA; that type of community involvement is what this is all about and we greatly appreciate it. The truss crane broke down Friday so we couldn't set the trusses on house #2. As we had a ton of folks both days, I put them to work building the 8x8 garden sheds we provide the homeowners. Additionally, we finished the interior and exterior framing on #1 and set the porch columns and porch framing on all three porches. We will set the trusses on both houses this Friday morning. Over the two days, we will set the trusses, then sheath and paper the roofs. Any extra help will finish the two garden sheds and dig some footers for the third house. Shingles on both roofs will be done the following Fri and Sat.

The team from OSW is working on this project on Friday and Saturday each week throughout the summer. LCMS Convention In July

The Lutheran Church Missouri Synod (LCMS) will meet in convention this summer in Houston, Texas. The dates of the convention are July 14-19. Conventions are held every three years. One pastoral delegate and one lay delegate from each circuit (group of 10-15 congregations) in the country will vote on the important issues faced by our church body. Pastor Mann is the pastoral delegate from Circuit 9B (our circuit) and will be attending the convention in July. The important issues facing the convention are:

- Elections—Church President and other officers
- Elections—Board of Directors of the LCMS
- Altar and Pulpit Fellowship—with the Association of American Lutheran Churches
- Concordia University System—changing the bylaws to allow for an increase to 17 members on each Board of Regents for these ten undergraduate colleges and universities (15,000 students)
- Alternate Route to Ordination—through the Specific Ministry Pastor Program which will not require all pastors to spend four years at the seminary, but will provide trained pastors who are certified for calls to specific ministry contexts (i.e. ethnic ministries, rural or inner city ministries)
- ABLAZE—supporting the ABLAZE mission focus of planting 5,000 new faith communities by the year 2017

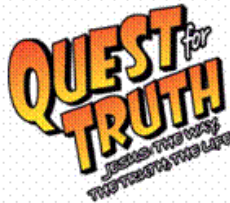

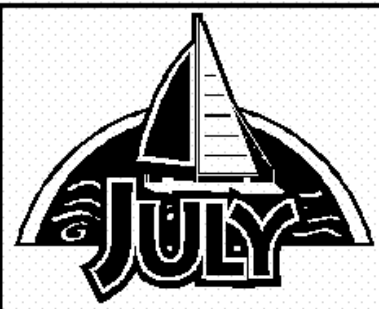

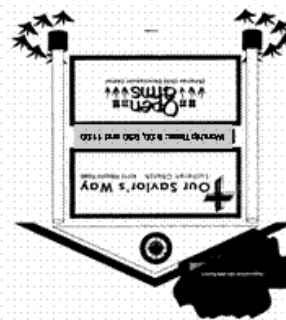
