Master Singers Concert to be held at Our Savior's Way Lutheran Church on March 2

ASHBURN, VA - February 13: The Master Singers will be performing a concert on Sunday, March 2, 2007 at 7pm at Our Savior's Way Lutheran Church in Ashburn, Virginia. The Master Singers performs mostly *a cappella*, but in this concert they will feature the playing of renowned organist Dr. Paul Skevington. He will accompany the ensemble on most of the concert, including one of Bruckner's greatest choral works, his *Mass in E Minor* for double choir. The group will also perform Poulenc's serene *Motets in a time of penitence*, and rousing choral and organ works by two of the greatest English composers of the 20th century, William Walton and Ralph Vaughan Williams. There will also be a pre-concert lecture at 6:15pm.

The cost of the concert is \$20 for adults (\$18 at the door) and \$13 for students or seniors (\$15 at the door). Tickets are available for purchase through the Master Singers web site at <http://msva.choralmusic.org> or at Our Savior's Way Lutheran Church. There will be a 50% discount on a second ticket of the same price if purchased at the church.

The Master Singers is the premiere mixed choral ensemble in Northern Virginia - thirty musicians who are dedicated to bringing the highest quality choral music to the people of the Washington, D.C. region. Concentrating primarily in 20th- and 21st-century music, the Master Singers use their concerts to enrich, educate, and entertain their audiences.

Our Savior's Way, along with the Open Arms Christian Child Development Center, has provided a caring atmosphere for the children of families in the Ashburn area for almost 10 years. Open Arms is open to children from 6 weeks to 12 years old and offers preschool, day care, before/after school care, and summer camp. They are located at the intersection of Waxpool Road and Claiborne Parkway (1 mile south of Exit 5 of the Greenway) and are currently expanding their facility to provide room for additional preschool, child care and community services.
