When nothing in life is certain, there is one certainty - God's love for us. Jesus encouraged the disciples, just like He encourages each of us this morning to remain in Him, and to remain in His Word, and to remain in His love. He is our anchor in the midst of the storm. The greater the storm the more we begin to realize the depth of the love God has for us. Our most blessed moments are not those of personal achievement and those moments that cause us to trust in ourselves, but those moments that push us into the hands of God.
