Often because of our sin and sinful nature, we find it easier to fear death, rather than to simply believe in the miracle that Jesus came to bring us. Yet, as believers of God's abundant grace, we know that Jesus' words are true time and time again. – Do not fear. Just Believe. –

And by God's grace, we do believe. Even though our sins bring to us a fear and uncertainly that comes with death. Because of our Lord's love and grace, Jesus gives to us forgiveness, healing and a greater understanding of the certainty of eternal life for all believers. He gives to us His Spirit; He gives to us His Word and Sacraments; so that we might not fear, but believe. And it's amazing even in our world today, that we can hold fast and believe that God gave His one and only Son, Jesus Christ, to die for us to make it possible. By His grace, we are saved for all eternity. Even St. Paul wrote, "...when the perishable puts on the imperishable, and the mortal puts on immortality, it shall come to pass the saying that is written, 'Death has been swallowed up in victory."" (1 Corinthians 15:54)
